Barbara (Ladi) Terry, age 72, passed away peacefully at Bloomington Hospital surrounded by family and friends. Born in St. Louis, MO she earned a BA in Elementary Education at St. Norbert College. Marrying her beau Tim Terry, they joined the Peace Corps in 1968. Teaching in Nigeria was a wonderful and enriching experience. Her name "Ladi" was given to her by the Nigerians. Returning in 1970, Ladi taught in Binghamton, NY while Tim attended graduate school at SUNY Binghamton. Always a kind innovator and collaborator, she was employed variously at Cornell University and SUNY. Moving to Michigan, she became Career Services Director at Ferris State University. Moving to Bloomington in 2003 she wrote a book "Celebrate The Messengers, Don't Shoot Them!" which exemplified her love of the field of creativity. Her business "Success Work" was aimed at allowing people to realize their creative potential and how to utilize it in everyday life. She holds two Masters Degrees, her favorite being her Masters in Creative Studies from Buffalo State University. Attending and presenting at creativity conferences all over the U.S., she stoked the exciting fires of creativity. She loved people of all walks of life and respected all religions and cultures. She was a pacifist and was always sympathetic to the plight of people in war-torn countries. She was preceded in death by her parents Paul and Vernell Rauch. She is survived by her husband of 50 years, Tim Terry, her children Kevin Terry and Chelsea Jones, her 4 grandkids, Lonnell Jones, Timothy Jones, Kailiyah Jones, and Brianna Terry. She also leaves behind her siblings Gerry Rauch (Rich Kacenski), Kathy Rauch (Michael O'Grady), Fr. David Rauch, and Bill Rauch (Nancy Alrutz) and many nieces and nephews.
