Harry E. Koeppen, D.V.M, 95, of Port Saint Lucie, Florida passed in his Florida residence on January 1, 2020.

Harry was born in La Porte, IN on May 2, 1924 to the late Harry W. and Ethel B. (Hutton) Koeppen. Harry attended La Porte High School and graduated in 1942. He went on to attend Purdue University for one year before joining the Navy as a Corpsman, he served for several years before returning home to finish his degree. Harry received his Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine from Iowa State University and practiced for a short time before opening his own practice in Bloomington. He retired in 1988. In addition to enjoying his retirement in Port Saint Lucie Harry was an avid reader and a lifelong church member. He was very active in his community and he belonged to many fraternal, societal, and professional organizations over the years.
