James Lawrence "Jim" Watson, 63, of Bloomington, passed away on Sunday, December 16, 2018. He was born on October 23, 1955 in Jasper, Indiana; the son of James Roy and Geraldine (Leonard) Watson.

The family moved from Loogootee to Indianapolis where Jim attended Pike Jr. High and graduated from Pike High School in 1974. He then enlisted in the United States Army and served in the National Security Agency. He re-enlisted and was a member of the 82nd Airborne Division. Jim was an entrepreneur.
