February 2, 1970 - June 5, 2020

Jason L. Kennedy, Attorney at Law, a resident of Chicago, Illinois and always a citizen of Bloomington, Indiana died as a result of a heart attack at the age of fifty years.

He was a 1988 graduate of Bloomington High School south where he ran cross country and track and was a senior class officer. He then graduated from Indiana University in 1992 from the School of Business and was president of his social fraternity, Sigma Alpha Epsilon. He went on to law school at Indiana University Bloomington and earned his Juris Doctorate in 1996. After completion of his studies he went to Chicago to begin the first of almost a quarter of a century of practice with the law firm of Segal, McCambridge, Singer, and Mahoney. He enjoyed his firm, the partners, associates, and support personnel and he truly enjoyed the practice of law. He served on the firm's executive committee and was chair of a major practice group within the firm.

He fully embraced Indiana University sports, the Liverpool Football Club and his association with men in Blazers.

He is survived by his brother Jeffrey L. Kennedy and his father, James L. Kennedy. His mother, Jerilyn L. Kennedy predeceased him in 1999. Also Aunt and Uncle, Mary Jean and Tim Greene, Aunt, Gail E. Kennedy and Uncle, Bill Jones, as well as several cousins and other relatives survive.

He would want it known to his special group of boyhood friends from Bloomington and to his later made friends from Chicago that he thought the world of them and deeply valued them for their friendship and years of support, comradeship, and loyalty. His family feels the same way. A gathering will be held later.
