



Michael Neil Wilkerson

October 12, 1955 - January 17, 2020

BLOOMINGTON -- Michael Neil Wilkerson passed away Friday, January 17, 2020, surrounded by loving family and friends at Hospice House in Bloomington, Indiana.

Michael was a professor of Arts Administration in the IU Bloomington O'Neill School of Public and Environmental Affairs, where he deeply loved teaching arts management and cultural policy. Previously, he was a professor of Arts Management in the Performing Arts Department at American University in Washington, D.C.

Michael earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana University Bloomington, pursuing wide-ranging interests in literature, politics, history, theatre, and journalism. As an undergraduate at IU, he lived at Collins Living Learning Center among a vibrant community of talented students who inspired his love of the arts. In 1979 he received an M.F.A. from the Writing Seminars at Johns Hopkins University, where he studied with the experimental novelist John Barth. A gifted writer, editor, and speaker, Michael's fiction was published in numerous literary journals.

From the mid-80s to the early 90s, Michael was director of Ragdale Foundation in Lake Forest, Illinois, one of the nation's preeminent artists' communities for working visual artists, writers, musicians and composers. In the mid-90s he served as director of the Provincetown Work Center in Provincetown, Massachusetts.

Throughout his life and career, Michael was a passionate advocate for artists. He worked on national issues as a board member of the Alliance of Artists Communities and the Association of Arts Administration Educators, and also served as a review panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts. Locally, he felt privileged to serve as a member of the Bloomington Arts Council, as a board member of the Buskirk-Chumley Theater, and as a founding board member of the Cardinal Stage Company.

Michael loved family life and adored his two sons, Dylan and Liam, and his wife, Deborah. He was beloved in the family for his patience and kindness, his exhaustive knowledge of

politics, his strange obsession with cooking competition shows, and his gift for transforming mundane errands into memorable adventures.

Michael was born on October 12, 1955, in Franklin, Indiana, to Anne and William Wilkerson. He will be forever loved and remembered by his wife of 39 years, Deborah Galyan; his two sons, Dylan Wilkerson of Louisville, Kentucky, and Liam Wilkerson, currently a sophomore at Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana; his mother, Anne Wilkerson; his brother, Rick Wilkerson; his nieces, Laura and Christie Wilkerson; his sister- and brother-in-law, Leah and Dan Siddons of Lafayette, and their children, Daniel and Noah Siddons.

“ Dear Mrs. Wilkerson:

I am deeply shocked and saddened to learn of Michael's passing. I knew him when he was a resident and R.A. at Collins (then still MRC) Living Learning Center and I was beginning my job as director of the Center. I loved his competence, his gaiety and ready wit and was always delighted to run into him occasionally thereafter. At the LLC he was also one of the "RKO Poets," as they called themselves, who wrote poems for people on specific occasions on the spur of the moment, for fifty cents or a dollar a poem. I still have one of these, written for me when my wife was gone for a few days. It goes like this:

perhaps the light / dimmer in the living room / some taste in the food / not there /
breathing her scent / on the pillow / only half of the heart / seems to beat / when love
