



Richard "Dick" Clark Hatch

June 17, 1936 - December 12, 2017

Richard "Dick" Clark Hatch, 81, of Bloomington, IN passed away on December 12, 2017. Dick was born on June 17, 1936 in Mobridge, South Dakota to Marion and Bertha Hatch. Dick grew up in McLaughlin, South Dakota, before graduating, in 1958, with a degree in Business Education from Northern State University. He began his career as a high school teacher in Wyoming, however, he wanted to see the world. He took the civil service exam and began his new career allowing him to travel to at least 10 countries over several decades. Dick became a member of the Baha'i faith in 1965 and remained devoted to his faith throughout his life, serving in many capacities. He married Sara Kay Lashmett on July 1, 1972. Together they pioneered to the Philippines, South Korea and Okinawa, Japan, before settling in Bloomington in 1987.

After retiring from Crane Naval base in 1993, Dick and Sara moved to Illinois to take care of his beloved mother-in-law, Marguerite Lashmett. In 1998, the Hatches returned to Bloomington, where Dick managed the By Hand Gallery. He was a great supporter of arts and artists, serving on the 4th Street Festival Committee for many years as well as championing Sara's art career.

Dick was a long-suffering fan of Indiana Football, Chicago Cubs Baseball, and a lover of puzzles, games, cooking, and laughter. He was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend to all who knew him, and he is survived by wife, Sara, his son Jeremy (wife Courtney), his daughter Jenna Amani (husband Carlo), and granddaughters Kira Amani and Kathryn Hatch. Dick was one of eleven siblings which included sisters Maxine Snodgrass, Myrna Hempel, Nancy Tobin, and Ferne Treloar as well as brothers Ray, Lowell, Burton, Maynard, Larry and Wayne Hatch, who survives.

The family will have a private burial at Clear Creek Cemetery. A memorial service will be held at 2pm on Saturday, December 16 at the Bloomington Baha'i Center, 424 S College Mall Rd. In lieu of flowers, memorial gifts may be made to Dance for Parkinson's and sent to 904 E. 1st St. Bloomington, IN 47401.

I'm profoundly sad that I wasn't able to see Richard again before he moved on to a better place. Not that any amount of time spent with the two of you ever would have been enough. But I am grateful that I learned of the service on Saturday, and I will be there. In the meantime, I'm here and thinking of you all.
