



Albert Eugene "Gene" Adams

December 13, 1927 - October 16, 2015

Albert Eugene "Gene" Adams, age 87 of Bloomington, passed away Friday evening, October 16, 2015 at the Indiana University Health Bloomington Hospital Hospice House. He was born in Bloomington on December 13, 1927 to Albert Adams and Gladys Marie Gilliland Adams.

After high school in Bloomington Gene went on to serve in the United States Navy during World War II. He served on the USS War Hawk AP-168 at Pearl harbor; the USS Anderson DD-411 in the Marshall Islands and finally the USS Kenneth Whiting AV-14 during the atomic tests at the Bikini Atoll.

Gene returned to Bloomington after the war and worked at RCA as a supervisor until retirement.

He is survived by his son Jeffrey Mark Adams of Bloomington; sisters Marilyn K. Graham and husband Wayne of Cape Coral, Florida, and Wilma Brown of Indianapolis, Indiana as well as several nieces and nephews. Gene was preceded in death by his parents, sons Terry Eugene, Dennis Patrick, and Bruce Lynn Adams; brother Lloyd Adams; sister Betty Chambers, and wife Blanche P. Isom Adams.

Graveside services with Reverend Donald Campbell presiding including military rites presented by the Monroe County Honor Guard will be conducted Wednesday October 21, 2015 at the Payne Cemetery at 11:30AM.
