Allen Robbins, 69, of Brownsburg, IN, passed away on Sunday, February 15th, at his home. Born on August 4th, 1956, he was the son of Mary and the late James Robbins.

Allen, a professional engine builder, worked for many top racing teams over his career. His work can be found at many circle tracks and drag strips across the country. He attended Bloomfield High School working for Gene Moody in Bloomfield in his spare time where, that exposure to racing engines made its mark and began his path in racing. Fond of old cars and quick engines he purchased his first car, a 1937 Chevy, at the age of 15. With no license, and only a desire to go fast, Allen recruited friend Mike Moody to drive the car home. From that point on Allen's life was committed to making horsepower and getting the drivers who used his engines into the winners circle.

Whether it was at the track or the shop, Allen was always available to help his customers taking pride in knowing he provided the best engines and support that he could. Allen walked through life with a calm demeanor while his racing engines made the noise for him.

In late 2004, during an interview, Allen was asked what would he be doing in five years. He quickly replied "the same thing, but a lot more if it. This is my life and I love it".

That's exactly what he did.

Allen is survived by his mother Mary and his brother Gayle R. Robbins.
