Anthony Carlo Mondelli age 30 of Bloomington, formerly of Copiague, New York passed away Thursday February 21, 2013 in Bloomington. He was born in West Islep, New York on January 13, 1983 to Anthony and Denise Somma Mondelli.

Anthony was a graduate of Copiague High School and attended both Farmingdale University and Briarcliff College.
