Bradley L. Hyland, 61, of Bloomington, passed away suddenly Wednesday at the IU Health Bloomington Hospital. He was the son of Gerald and Betty (Gaston) Hyland born on December 9, 1952 in Shelbyville, Illinois.

Bradley graduated from Windsor High School in 1970 and studied Safety Engineering thru Kennedy-Western University.
