



## Chris Mason Wagner

August 19, 1931 - June 23, 2015

Chris Mason Wagner, 83, of Nashville, died peacefully on June 23, 2015 at IU Health Bloomington with his family by his side. Chris was born in Metuchen, NJ on August 19, 1931 to Christian and Aletha Wagner.

Chris graduated from Wesleyan University and received his M.A. from Columbia University. He worked at International Latex Corp., William Esty, Advertising, Columbia University TC Press, and the Educational Media Council/US Office of Education. At the Educational Media Council he met and collaborated with Carolyn Guss, who was a professor of education in the Instructional Systems Technology department at Indiana University. As a result, Chris came to Bloomington to pursue a degree in Communication Studies at Indiana University and made Bloomington and Brown County his home. Chris worked at the Indiana University Audio-Visual Center, retiring in 1996 as Director of Field Services.

Chris is survived by his wife of 31 years, Beverly Teach, his

daughter, Amy Wagner (husband Mike Morgan), granddaughter Esme Morgan, nephew Jeffery Grove (wife Margareta), and two great nephews, Eric and Christian Grove. He was preceded in death by his parents, his sisters, Mildred Moessner, Dorothy Grove, Georgette Schoenfelder, and his son, Andrew Wagner.

Chris enjoyed painting, photography, and other creative arts, nature, and wildlife, and IU basketball. He was a loving husband, a compassionate father, deeply thoughtful, and as kind as they get. He will be greatly missed by family and friends, and by furry friends Buster and Mercedes.
