Clovis E. Carmichael, 93, of Smithville, passed away Sunday evening at I.U. Hospice House in Bloomington. He was born July 21, 1919 in Greene County the son of Ray and Addie (Floyd) Carmichael and attended Solsberry High School. He retired from RCA of Bloomington after 31 years of service. He was an Army veteran of World War II and received one bronze star for injuries while serving in Central Europe.

Clovis was a charter member of the Southside Christian Church in Smithville and served for several years as an elder. His devotion to his faith and to his church was the foundation of his life, to serve his wife and family and be a contributing member of his community. All who knew him appreciated his steadfast belief in his faith and his willingness to stand up for them.
