Danny A Beyers, 72 of Bedford passed away peacefully on Monday evening, April 20, 2015 at Core Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Bedford, IN. He had been a resident of Core for four years. He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Susan (Shisler) Beyers; sons Marc and Eric (wife Robin) Beyers and four grandchildren; his brother Michael P.
