David C. Nowlin, age 85 passed away peacefully Tuesday afternoon December 29, 2015 at the Indiana University Health Bloomington Hospice House. He was born June 20, 1930 in Wartrace, Tennessee to J.W. Nowlin and Margaret "Maggie" Waddey Nowlin.

He was a graduate of Lenoir City High School in Lenoir City, Tennessee, received his bachelors degree from Carson-Newman University in Jefferson City, Tennessee and masters degree in education from U.S.C.
