



## Dr. Donald Clarence Tyte D.D.S.

Dr. Donald Clarence Tyte, D.D.S. age 90 of Bloomington passed away Monday morning August 7, 2017 at the Meadowood Heath Pavilion. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio to Clarence and Jessie Smith Tyte.

Donald was a graduate of Wabash High School in 1944, and Indiana University where he received both his B.S. and D.D.S. While he was at Indiana University he was a member of the Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity.

He was very proud of his service in the United States Army Air Corp where he participated in the preliminary training for the future space program. Donald's dental practice in Bloomington spanned over 40 years and was very active with various organizations including the Bloomington Country Club, First Methodist Church, The Elks Club, American Legion, The Boy Scouts, Little League Baseball and Football where he served as a director and past President, Indiana Senior Golf Association, and as president of both the Monroe County Dental and South Central Indiana Dental Societies.
