October 18, 1938 - July 5, 2023

Donald E. Weaver, 84, of Bloomington, Indiana, went home to Jesus on Wednesday, July 5, 2023, at IU Health University Hospital in Indianapolis.

Don was born on October 16, 1938, to Earl Dickerhoff and Edith Magnuson (Stephey) in Elkhart, Indiana.

In 1956, he graduated from Elkhart High School, where he first met Barb Monschein. They were married on August 23, 1959, and would devote the next 64 years of their lives to each other.

After graduating high school, Don attended Indiana University where he earned a Bachelor of Science in business administration in 1961. He was also a member of Delta Upsilon fraternity.

Following graduation, Don immediately went to work for IU, where he would enjoy a successful 40-year career serving under seven IU presidents.

He worked as an analyst for University Systems & Methods (1961-1963); an analyst for the University Budget Office (1963-1964); director of University Facilities Management & Planning (1964-1989); and, ultimately, director of IU's Office of State Relations (1989-2004), where he served as the primary liaison between IU and the legislative and executive branches of Indiana

government.

Don also served as timekeeper for the world-renowned Little 500 bicycle race, the largest collegiate bike race in the United States.

For his outstanding service to IU, Don received numerous awards, including the President's Medal for Excellence (2003), the IU Foundation President's Medallion (2002), and the E. Ross Bartley Award (1999), the university's highest staff honor. Don also received a State of Indiana honor, the Sagamore of the Wabash award, issued by then Governor Frank O'Bannon.

As a founding and devoted member of Faith Lutheran Church, Don served in numerous administrative and leadership roles. In addition, he volunteered his time to the Boys Club, Bloomington Little League, Meals on Wheels, and the Salvation Army.

He served on the board at the IU Credit Union for many years.

An enthusiastic and lifelong IU sports fan, Don loved attending basketball, football, and baseball games. Even more, he enjoyed travelling the country to watch his beloved grandchildren participate in their sports and activities. Don enjoyed playing golf. Upon retirement, Don and Barb were blessed to be able to travel the world.

In addition to his wife, Don is survived by his children, Eric (Karen) Weaver, Darcy Weaver, and Jason (Chris) Weaver; his grandchildren, Jared Weaver, Ella Weaver, and Emery Weaver; his sister, Jacqueline Armstrong; and many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents and his step-mother, Bertha

Dickerhoff.

A funeral service will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 8, 2023, at Faith Lutheran Church in Bloomington. A visitation will be held from 11:00 a.m. until time of service, also at the church. Burial will follow at Clover Hill Cemetery in Harrodsburg.

The family has asked that memorial contributions be made to Faith Lutheran Church Endowment or to the Salvation Army.
