Donald C. Traub, 84, of Bloomington, Indiana died on July 29, 2015. He was born July 9, 1931 to Carl and Mary Traub in Lafayette, Indiana.

He attended Jordan Conservatory of Music in Indianapolis, Indiana. He received a Bachelor degree of Music Education in 1953, Indiana University Bloomington, Indiana. Master in Science and Music in 1954 from the University of Illinois. Pursued post graduate work from 1962-1977 at Indiana University. He received a certificate from Salzburg Summer School in Salzburg, Austria in 1966.

He was the director of bands of the Winchester Schools in Winchester, Indiana from 1954-1959. He was the director of band for Monroe County Community Schools, primarily Bloomington South, from 1959-1981. He was guest director of Rose Hulman Institute of Technology in Terre Haute, Indiana in 1978.

He was Phi Delta Kappa, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Fellow, General Electric Institute.
