Edrice J. Baker, 95, of Unionville, Indiana passed away on Saturday, January 11, 2020 at Brown County Health and Living Center. Edrice was born on June 30, 1924 in Greencastle, IN to the late David and Pearl (Conley) Jent. She attended and graduated from Spencer High School in Spencer, IN and went on to graduate from Indiana University with her Master's Degree in Elementary Education. Edrice was a teacher for 20 years, as well as, the Education Director at Fairview Methodist Church. She taught at Hunter Elementary School until they closed, and went to work at Unionville Elementary School until she retired. After Edrice retired, she opened an art gallery in Unionville called the Goose and Gander Art Farm. She frequently sold paintings from local artists in her gallery, and in her eighties even started painting herself. Edrice loved to travel and over the years had visited Africa, Mexico, and France. She was active in her community and was a member of the Unitarian Universalist Church for many years. Edrice was a beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother. She will be deeply missed. Edrice is survived by her son, Mike Baker (Cindy); daughter, Mary Ann Chitwood (Greg); brother, Dallas Jent; 5 grandchildren, AnnaMarie Sparks, Tony Sparks, Clinton Chitwood, Amanda Chitwood Richardson, and Katy Cradick.; 4 great- grandchildren, Tucker and Hunter Chitwood, Henry Cain, and Pearl Cradick.

Edrice is preceded in death by her husband, Clifford Baker; her parents; daughter, Martha Susan Plew; brothers, David Jent Jr. and Denver Jent; and
