



Eileen Appleton

July 11, 1918 - December 6, 2009

Eileen Appleton, 91 years, of Bloomington, died at Bell Trace on Sunday, December 6, 2009. Eileen was born on July 11, 1918, in LaPorte, Indiana, to J. Frank and Ruth Kincaid Stoder. She was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church, Business and Professional Women, Soroptimist Club, and was a founding member in 1940 of Eastern Star Chapter #569. Eileen graduated from Indiana University with four degrees including a PhD in Adult Education. She was awarded membership in Phi Alpha Theta, Pi Lambda Theta, and Epsilon Sigma Phi, honorary fraternities. She was also listed in Who's Who of American Women. After teaching History and English at Richmond Senior High School in Richmond, Indiana, she returned to Indiana University as an Academic Administrative Assistant, Teaching Associate, and Special Projects Research Associate from 1955 to 1971. She then moved to the University of Missouri where she was Area Continuing Education Specialist and Adjunct Professor of Adult Education from 1971-1982. She also authored many reports and articles. Dr. Appleton is survived by two sisters, Maxine Jones of South Bend, Indiana, and Dorothy Boekemeier of St. Louis, Missouri, as well as five nieces. She was preceded in death by her parents and her former husband, Theodore H. Appleton, who died November 26, 1984. Memorial Services will be at 10 a.m. on Saturday, December 12, 2009, at Trinity Episcopal Church. There will be no visitation.
