Frances Murl (Izen) Weinberg died February 8, 2025, age 96 years. Born in Cleveland OH, but moved to Chicago IL with her family at age 4y and considered it her hometown. Predeceased by her loving husband of 69 years, Eugene D. Weinberg, PhD, and by two of her children Marjorie J. Weinberg Hewitt and Michael B. Weinberg. Survived by two children, Barbara A. (Weinberg) Sturbaum of Bloomington, and Geoffrey A. Weinberg, MD of Rochester, NY, as well as by 4 loving grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren. After graduation from the University of Chicago, she married Eugene in 1949 and together they moved to Bloomington in 1950. Fran later obtained a master's degree in education from Indiana University, launching a long career in the MCCSC schools. Fran educated hundreds of local children, first as a substitute teacher, then as a 4th grade teacher at Childs Elementary School (1969-1985) and then as a school volunteer there (1985-2001). She also was a charter member of Temple Beth Shalom, serving as its President and as a member of several committees over the years. Fran loved volunteering at WonderLab Museum, WFIU/WTIU, and other local community organizations. She was a member and past president of the local chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma, a professional society for women educators. A memorial service will take place at a later date. Contributions can be made to Temple Beth Shalom, WonderLab Museum, or the Monroe County Community Schools Foundation.
