Gary Alan Benassi, age 69, of Bloomington, IN, went home to be with his Lord and Savior at 5:06 p.m. on Sunday, December 19, 2021 at IU Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis with his loving wife, Teresa Benassi, and devoted niece, Maureen Langley, at his side. He was the son of Denzil and Merladene Benassi. Gary is survived by his wife, Teresa (Miller) Benassi, his dog, Jagger, and cat, Hazel. He is also survived by 21 very special nieces and nephews whom he greatly loved as his own children, and one sister, Lori (Paul) Shaver, of Muncie, IN. He had two paternal half-brothers and half-sisters, and a stepfather, Jim Cawood.
