J. Richard (Dick) Hasler, 96, of Bloomington passed away March 13, 2020. Dick, the son of the late Ralph and Hazel Whitaker Hasler, grew up in Newberry, Indiana, graduated from Indiana University and served in the U.S. Army during World War II. Following the war, he lived in Chicago for some 35 years, working as a national buyer for Sears Roebuck. After retiring, he and his partner James O. Noel moved to Bloomington in 1987.
