Jack Edgar Robinson, 75, died on March 15, 2024, at his home in Bloomington, Indiana. Jack was born on October 30, 1948, in Massena, NY to loving parents Clarence and Dorothy Robinson.

Jack graduated from Massena Central High School in 1965 and went on to pursue his associate degree at Canton ATC. During this time, Jack was employed at Alcoa Aluminum Company.
