James Boyd Alexander, age 57 of Bloomington passed away early Monday morning September 6, 2010 at the Bloomington Hospital. Jim was born in Bloomington on December 5, 1952 to Robert L. and Evelyn Freeman Alexander. He was a graduate of University High School and spent his professional career as the owner of Alexander's Camper Sales, a company that he and his father founded.
