James Clayton Carmichael, 87, of Ellettsville and a former 60 year resident of Stanford passed away on Tuesday evening, May 8, 2012 at Richland-Bean Blossom Health Care in Ellettsville. He was born on February 13, 1925 in Greene County the son of Ray and Addie (Floyd) Carmichael and attended Solsberry High School. He retired after forty-two years as a planerman in the limestone industry and was an Army veteran of World War II, having received three bronze stars for injuries suffered during the war. He was a lifelong fan of the New York Yankees and I.U. Basketball, always waiting to see what the next season's team would be like. Clayton was of the protestant faith and loved to coach little league baseball and was a member of the Mill Workers Union.
