James Wayne Mahoney, 80, of Ellettsville, passed away Friday, March 10, 2017 at IU Health Bloomington Hospice House. He was born on March 15, 1936 in South Bend, Indiana, the son of Wayne Robert and Wilma Hazel (Martin) Mahoney.

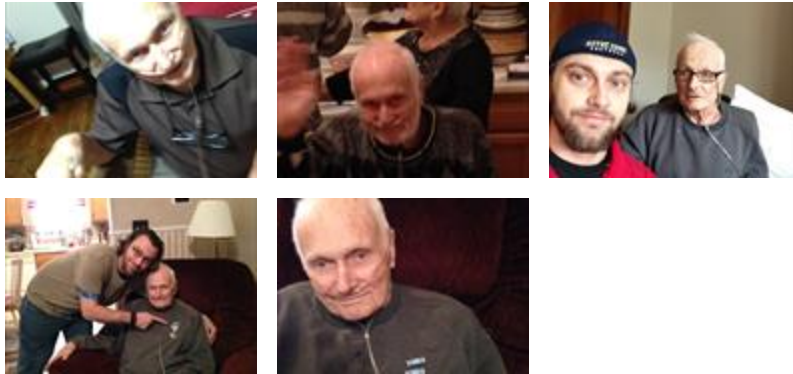

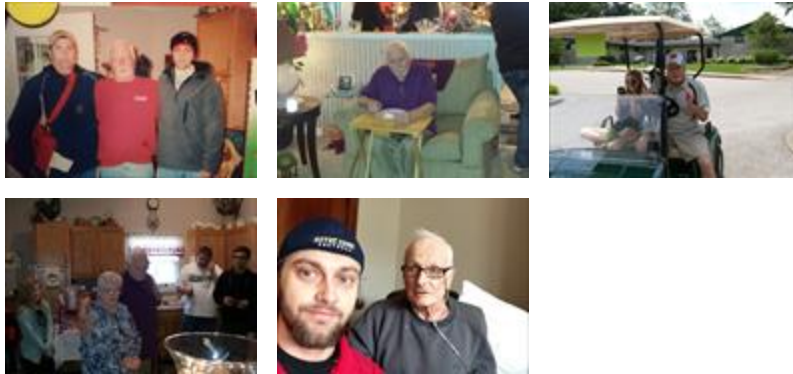
