



## James Martin Elliott

December 2, 1942 - July 28, 2009

James Martin Elliott of Bloomington passed away Tuesday July 28, 2009 at the Indiana University Medical Center in Indianapolis. He was 66 years old. Jim was born December 2, 1942 in Owensboro, Kentucky to James Glen and Margaret Thomson Elliott. He graduated from Owensboro Senior High in 1959 before going to Indiana University where he completed both his undergraduate and Jurisprudence Doctorate in 1963 and 1968 respectively. Jim spent the first part of his professional as an attorney with the law firm of Wilson and Wilson in Owensboro, Kentucky before returning to Bloomington to join the Indiana University Foundation and to found his financial advisory firm of Elliott and Associates. He was very active in various organizations throughout his life and most recently served as a Board Member to the Bloomington Hospital Foundation, the Indiana University varsity Club, the Indiana University Alumni Association, and the Brown County Play House. He along with his wife, Jannette, were members of the First United Methodist Church. Jim leaves behind his wife Jannette White of Bloomington; daughter Buffy Heldt and her husband Carl of Miami, Florida; daughter Lexi Klein and her husband Tom of Avon, Indiana and son Drew Elliott and his partner Macky Dugan of New York City, New York. He also leaves behind his grandchildren Katie and Carl Heldt as well as Mats, Evan, and Cameron Heldt. Jim is survived by his brother Larry Glen Elliott and his wife Patsy of Martinsville, Indiana as well. Funeral Services will be conducted Friday July 31, 2009 at 1:00PM at the First United Methodist Church 219 East Fourth Street,

Bloomington. Burial will be in the Rose Hill Cemetery. Visitation for Jim will be on Thursday July 30, 2009 from 5:00PM until 8:00PM at the Allen Funeral Home, 4155 South Old Highway 37 Bloomington. “ I was saddened to read of Mr. Elliott's passing yesterday in the online version of the Owensboro newspaper. My father, Cleve Townsend, and Mr. Elliott were good friends growing up, as I recall. My dad always spoke very highly of "RoundMan"--he must have been friends with everyone. My dad actually lived with the Elliotts for awhile in the late 50's or early 60's. I believe their house was located on Frederica Street, across from Union Station. There's a Pizza Hut there now, but I'm almost positive that their house stood there once upon a time.

I finally met Mr. Elliott for the first time when I was 15. He had come to the hospital to visit my dad, who was terminally ill with cancer. I know it meant a lot to my dad that Mr. Elliott made the trip back to Owensboro to see him one last time. My wife and I have two photos of Mr. Elliott framed and hanging on the wall in our upstairs hallway--one is the "O" Club (circa 1959) and the other is the 1960 OHS Baseball team.
