April 24, 1918 - November 12, 2012

Jane Evans Penfold Squire, 94, of Springville, died November 12, 2012 at her home in Greene County, Indiana. She was born on April 24, 1918 in St. Paul, Minnesota. She grew up in Stewartville, Minnesota, attended Hamline University, and graduated from University of Missouri with a BA in journalism. She was a veteran, having served as an officer in the US Navy (Waves) during WWII. Following the retirement of her husband, Harris Squire, from the Navy at Crane in 1968, she has resided in Sullivan, Brown, and Greene counties in Indiana. She was adventurous and loved to travel. She obtained her pilot's license in the 1930's and climbed the Great Wall of China at age 86. In between, she spent 6 months in Nepal and India, visited Great Britain, Switzerland, and Mexico, and toured Europe. She volunteered for Meals On Wheels, League of Women Voters, and adult tutoring programs. She is survived by her daughters Susan Pirtle (Terry) of Greene County, Janet Squire (John Lindsay) of Colorado, Ruth Squire (Ray Ng) of California, grandchildren Sarah Pirtle Fipps (Ryan), Jacob Pirtle, Nathan Deckard (Cai Qin), Andrea Deckard, Evan Deckard, Alec Deckard, David Deckard, Walter Deckard, Matthew Squire, Meghan Lindsay, Sierra Squire, Benjamin Ng, Samuel Ng, Christian Ng, Lawrence Ng, and great grandchildren Adam Pirtle, Victoria Deckard, and Brody
