Jean M. Swope, 91, of Bloomington, Indiana, died December 9, 2010. She was born on March 5, 1919 in Romney, Indiana to Mabel and George Inskeep. In 1940, she graduated from Indiana University and married Ammon Swope, Jr. in 1943. Jean traveled with Ammon to the various bases he was stationed at during the war and after the war they returned to Romney, where she reared two daughters. Jean was employed by Farmers Home Administration, first in Attica, Indiana, then in Lafayette, Indiana. Upon retirement, Jean moved to Honolulu, where she lived for nearly 20 years. In 2000, after Ammon's death, Jean moved to Meadowood Retirement Community in Bloomington, Indiana, where she had a convivial circle of friends. She was an avid bridge player and reader, and she loved doing crossword and jigsaw puzzles. Enjoying good health all her life, she was able to travel extensively and took a trip with her daughters to Panama to celebrate her 90th birthday. Recently she told one of her daughters that she had visited the two places she most wanted to see: the Great Wall of China and the Taj Mahal. Jean is survived by two daughters, Cynthia Swope of Reston, Virginia, and Patricia Swope of New Haven, Connecticut. Her three grandchildren, Nicholas Kukla, Daniel Kukla and Anna Kukla, reside in Brooklyn, New York. A memorial celebration for friends and family will be held at Meadowood Retirement Community on Monday, December 13, 2010 at 3:30.
