



## John Clare "Jack" Moore

May 17, 1933 - August 12, 2025

John Clare "Jack" Moore, 92, passed away in Fishers on Tuesday, August 12, 2025. He was born in Wichita, KS, May 17, 1933, the son of John Howard and Kathyne Helen (Kirlin) Moore. He grew up in Beattie, KS followed by Kansas City, MO, where he graduated from Rockhurst College in 1955. As a Fulbright scholar, he attended the University of Louvain in 1958-59 and in 1960 earned a Ph. D. in medieval European history from Johns Hopkins University. Almost all of his professional career was spent teaching at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY. He was author of a number of scholarly works on medieval Europe and Pope Innocent III.

Moore married his beloved wife Patricia in 1955, and together they raised four children. He and Pat retired to Bloomington, IN in 1998, where he has been an active member of St. Paul Catholic Center and the St. Vincent de Paul Society of Bloomington.

Moore was preceded in death by his wife, Patricia A. (Hix) Moore and his son John C. Moore, Jr. He is survived by daughters Joan M. Vanore, Carolyn R. Moore, Mary P. Vukelich, daughter-in-law Maureen Moore, and by six grandchildren.

A funeral service for Moore will be held at 10:30 AM at St. Paul Catholic Center in Bloomington on Saturday, August 16, 2025, with visitation starting at

10:15 a.m. Burial will follow at Valhalla Memory Gardens. Allen Funeral Home was entrusted to the care of these arrangements.
