Joy Baranko, 84, passed away peacefully in her sleep during the night of Friday, June 17th while residing at the First Community Village Long Term Care with Hospice in Columbus, OH. Following a series of health issues, she had moved to Columbus to be near her daughter, Cassie.

Joy was born July 9, 1926 in Vincennes, IN, but lived the majority of her life in Bloomington, IN. Friendly and outgoing, she was an active member of a service organization, Psi Chi, that ran a Thrift Shop in Bloomington. She worked at the Indiana University golf course and was also an avid golfer, playing and winning awards at the IU course and local country club. Joy also won trophies as a member of a local bowling league. She was always a sports fan, especially college sports, and remained a loyal fan of Indiana University, in particular. Her jovial, social nature and lively sense of humor was appreciated by many throughout her life.
