Julia Page Major was born in Chestatee, Georgia on March 4, 1918. Died April 3, 2015 in Bloomington, Indiana. Her Father was a Mining Engineer in the Copper mines in Dahlonega, Georgia.

The family eventually settled in San Diego, California, where she married Walter Hammond Major in 1936, Together they worked in India as missionaries for some 20 years. Later they ran the headquarters in the US for a large Indian orphanage out of their home on Long Island, N. Y. They retired to Western Pennsylvania, to a beautiful farm in Somerset County. Here they spent many wonderful years enjoying their grandchildren who lived nearby.

Julia's husband passed away at age 91 and she shortly moved to Bloomington to be cared for by her son-in-law and daughter.

Her two sons Joseph H. Major and Michael T. Major preceded her in death.

She is survived by her son-in-law Joe, and daughter Eleanor Major Rice, her daughter-in-law Vera M. Major, two grand sons Joseph H. Rice and Jonathan C. Major grand daughters Joanna P. Bowyer and Jessica L. Major and eight great grandchildren.
