Julia "Julie" Ann Robertson, 48, of Bloomington, passed away Tuesday with her family by her side. She was born on August 2, 1964 in Bloomington, IN; she was the daughter of Don and Jan (McDonald) Robertson. Julia graduated from Bloomington High School South. She then went on to DePauw University and received a Bachelor of Science degree. Julia was a very active member in the Church of the Savior United Methodist in Cincinnati, OH. She worked for IU Health in Indianapolis and then went to work for the Cincinnati Children's Hospital.
