Larry A. Rademacher, 76, of Ellettsville, Indiana, went to his heavenly home on April 2, 2020, at Bloomington Hospital after a long battle with pulmonary disease. He was born on January 11, 1944, the son of Edwin and Marie (Downey) Rademacher.
