Lloyd W. Rothrock, 60, of Bloomington passed away on Wednesday evening, Nov. 28th at I.U. Health-Bloomington Hospital. He was born in Corydon, Indiana the son of Sherman and Ethel (Taylor) Rothrock and graduated from Corydon High School in 1970. He attended United Electronics Institute and earned an Associate's Degree as an Electronics Technician. He worked for the Bluegrass Army Depot near Lexington, KY until it closed and then came to work at Crane Naval Weapons Support Depot until retiring. He had over 40 years of civil service to his credit.
