Jean was just a kid and soon Missouri, their home called them back. She attended Roosevelt High School in St. Louis, MO where she met Bob, her husband of 64 years. Bob died in April of this year. Jean tells the story of going to visit Bob at Tulane during Mardi Gras during their courtship. Apparently a good time was had by all - Bob had to stand Captain's Mast because he returned to the barracks late.

Jean was a force majeure. She was strong-willed and spontaneous. She loved God. She was a member of Sherwood Oaks Christian Church. She loved her family and friends and her myriad animals. She was particularly fond of her mini-horse, swans and dogs of which she had tons during her life. She made a beautiful home and was an excellent cook who always provided lots of food!
