Life was enjoyed immensely by Margaret Catherine Urton of Bloomington, Indiana, wife of the late James W. Urton; former wife of Ronald R. Terrell, and mother of Ronald R Terrell, Jr. and Catherine Anne Terrell.

The daughter of Ottis Howell Silvers and Alice Catherine (Cole) Silvers, she was born June 14, 1939 in Osceola, Arkansas. Her family then settled in Jackson Co., Indiana. Interest in music and vocal performance began during her childhood, and graduation from Brownstown High School in 1956 led to study at Indiana University's School of Music where she was a member of the Belles of Indiana, giving musical performances in various cities in the Midwest as well as in Europe and in the Caribbean. At the university she studied singing with professors Agnes Davis, Byron Taylor and Eugene Bayless.

Following graduation, she was a teacher in North Carolina and in Virginia before returning to Bloomington where she spent several years as an administrator at Indiana University, and as a part-time faculty member, teaching for six years in the university's School of Public and Environmental Affairs. During the same time she was employed as a private consultant to organizations in Indianapolis, Richmond, West Lafayette and Bloomington.

Margaret and her husband Jim retired to Bozeman, Montana in 1989 and later to Cody, Wyoming. Much time was spent in both locations playing golf, bridge,

and fly fishing with Jim. After his death in 2011 she returned to Bloomington, Indiana. She was a member of of First United Methodist Church in Bloomington.

Margaret is survived by her beloved children Ronald Jr. and Catherine, her sisters, Shirley J. (James) Erne of Ft. Worth, TX and Rebecca (Joseph) Goss of Bloomington, Jim's daughter Lisa Urton Means and her daughter Lauren Means, several nieces and nephews and their families. She was preceded in death by her parents and brother, O. Howard Silvers.
