Marquita Jo Littell, age 94 of Bloomington passed away early Saturday morning, May 2, 2015 at the Indiana University Health Bloomington Hospice House. She was born in Bicknell, Indiana on July 29, 1920 to Jean Littell and Sada Witsman Littell.

Marquita Jo earned her Bachelor's Degree from Ball State University and her Master's Degree from Indiana University in Music Education. Before devoting her entire professional career to music education, with the encouragement from her father, she worked in Washington D.C. during World War II decoding for the United States military intelligence operations. After her work there she taught music at the Minnesota Christian College in Minneapolis, the Plainville Schools, Worthington Schools, and in the Hammond, Indiana School system. She ultimately settled in Bloomington where she played an active role with Sherwood Oaks Christian Church as a member and an adult religious education teacher and Sunday School teacher.

She is survived by cousins Jack Nowling of Vincennes, Indiana and Betty Nowling Wacker of Colorado. She will be dearly missed by other family members, close friends and the care givers who so

lovingly cared for her in her later days.

Graveside services for Marquita Jo will be held Tuesday, May 5, 2015 at 11:00AM in the Plainville Cemetery in Plainville, Indiana.
