Max Bohrer passed away on December 23, 2010 at the age of 96. Mr. Bohrer was retired from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. He was a licensed Professional Engineer and a licensed attorney in Indiana and Kentucky. He served with the Corps of Engineers in the Philippines during World War II. Mr. Bohrer was past President of St. Marks United Church of Christ, a former member of the New Albany Kiwanis Club and a former member of the New Albany Plan Commission.

He is survived by his wife of 70 years, Anna Bohrer and his sons John Bohrer (Carol Anne) of Houston Texas and James Bohrer (Denise) of Bloomington, Indiana. He is also survived by one grandson, Nicholas Bohrer of Houston, Texas. His 4 brothers and 2 sisters predeceased him.
