Nancy Lee Fender, 67 of Bloomington went to be with the Lord Thursday November 27th, 2014 at her home after a long battle with cancer.

Born October 5, 1947 in Monroe County, she was the daughter of Holland and Clea (Inman) Carmichael.

After graduating from Indiana University in 1969 she became a school teacher at Eastern Greene Elementary where she taught 1st grade for 34 years. She was also a long time member of Cincinnati Christian Church.
