Norman L. Swick, 78 of Newnan, GA, formally of Alton, passed away at his home on Tuesday, April 27, 2021 surrounded by his wife and children following a two-year battle with lung cancer. Norman was born in Bloomington, IN to Dr. Ralph and Dorothy (Morrison) Swick on June 13, 1942. On June 2, 1965, he married Judy (Winkleman) Swick of Harrisburg, IL, who shared 55 years together and stayed by his side during his illness.

Norman graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Art Education and a Master's degree in Art History from Southern Illinois University.
