Patricia W. Burner of Bloomington, passed away on Monday, July 2, 2018 at Jill's House. Pat was born on April 24, 1927 in Argonia, Kansas to Robert and Marie (Wagoner) Hoskins. She was married to the late Charles Burner for fifty-three years.

Pat cared deeply about people. She taught pre-school Sunday School classes for thirty years and volunteered in nursing facilities, food pantries, and an overnight shelter. She helped develop the Caring Ministry program at First United Methodist Church in Bloomington and chaired the Nursing Home and Assisted Living Ministry.

Pat graduated from Wellington High School in Wellington, Kansas and received her Bachelor's Degree from Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kansas. She completed graduate work at West Virginia University and received a Master of Science Degree from the University of Evansville.

Pat taught Physical Science and Chemistry in Pochontas and Randolph Counties in West Virginia. After moving to Indiana, she taught Biology and Physical Science at Memorial High School in Evansville for nine years.

After moving to Bloomington in 1979, Pat worked at Indiana University for sixteen years. She retired from her position as manager of Chemistry

Scientific Stores in 1995.
