Paul Rhoades Weakley passed away Oct. 31, 2018 night at the age of 97. He attended Shortridge High School in Indianapolis, followed by Hanover College and Butler University where he graduated with a degree in Biology. He was also the Butler Team basketball team's manager under Tony Hinkle. He served in WWII, in the Pacific, as an B25 bomber aircraft mechanic. After the War he married his long time sweetheart, Susan Weakley (now deceased), and spent the majority of his life as a Manager and Director\VP at Indiana Bell Telephone (AT&T), at various locations throughout the state, the majority of time was in Indianapolis. After his retirement, Paul worked HR consulting for major medical firms in Northern Indiana, plus conducted business professional management workshops at Purdue University. He was also a prolific painter and his family now share those paintings from his collection.
