Peter Michael "Pete" Sartoris, 60, of Solsberry, passed away on Thursday, February 11, 2021 at the IU Health Bloomington Hospital with his loving wife by his side.

Pete was born in Troy, Illinois on April 2, 1960 to James and Agnes (Ashman) Sartoris. He graduated from Indiana University in 1984 with a Bachelor of Science in Geology and went on to earn a Master's degree in Business Administration from Indiana State University. Pete was a Certified Professional Geologist and worked for 36 years for the Indiana Department of Natural Resources as the Assistant Director of Compliance, Technical Services, and Permitting.

Pete married Rashul Joan Brosman on October 19, 2007 in Spencer, Indiana. 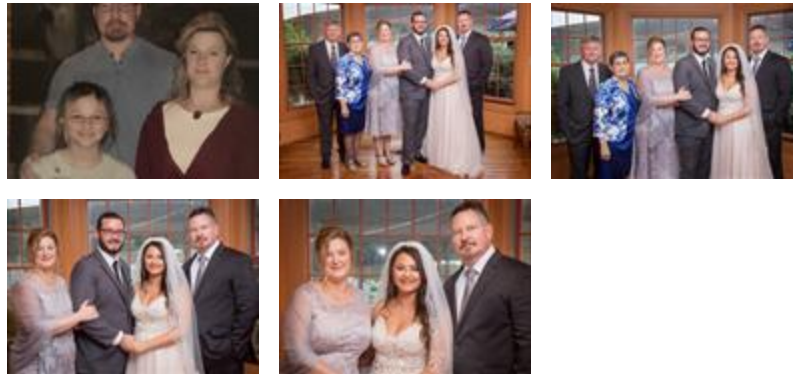
