



## Richard Lloyd Eherenman

February 11, 1926 - April 17, 2020

Richard Lloyd Eherenman, “Dick”, also known as husband, Dad, Grampy and Great Grampy went to be with his Lord and Savior on April 17, 2020. He passed peacefully with his cherished wife, Marjorie, and daughter, Sarah, at his side at age 94.

Dick was born in Goshen, IN on Feb. 11, 1926 to his proud parents, Lloyd Byron Eherenman and Aimee Washington Eherenman. He was raised in Plymouth, IN. where his father was the high school band director. Dick played the baritone in high school.

Richard served in the US Navy abroad the USS Arkansas during WW II. He witnessed the raising of the American Flag at Iwo Jima. Dick attended Wabash college and later graduated from Butler University where he was a member of the Phi Delta Theta fraternity and he earned a BA degree in Business. He loved his “Butler Bulldogs” and remained a fan his entire life.

Richard married the love of his life Marjorie Lois Vore also from Plymouth, IN. They eloped on April 15, 1949 and just celebrated their 71 anniversary. They moved to Bloomington, IN and purchased a Culligan franchise..... “Hey Culligan Man”. Dick and Marge joined St. Marks UMC in 1956 where he sang in the choir. He stayed active with Jaycees, Elks Club, was a member of American Legion - Post 18, and member of WFIU. He served on the

Bloomington Utilities Board and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Dick worked the IU Fun Frolic for many years. He went to work for Indiana University in the Purchasing Department where he retired in 1998 after 25 years.

Dick and Marge raised their four beloved children - family was always first. The family enjoyed an annual 2 week camping trip each summer and made a visit to 48 states. He enjoyed boating especially at Lake Monroe - water skiing, fishing, and swimming often culminating with a picnic dinner for 6. Dick and Marge enjoyed riding their Honda Gold Wing Motorcycle on trips with friends, long afternoon rides and taking grandkids on "short trips". He bowled, played poker, loved playing golf, and played bridge in several bridge groups with Marge. Dick treasured his many lifetime friends.

Richard is survived by his loving wife, Marjorie Lois Eherenman and their four children: Susan (Steve) Gobert of Columbus, IN, David (Sandi) Eherenman of N. Fort Myers, FL, Sarah (Pat) True of Bloomington, IN, Sally (Mark) Scott of Fort Myers, FL.
