Richard Warren James, age 93 of Bloomington, passed away Sunday morning, January 26, 2014 at the Indiana University Health Bloomington Hospital. He was born February 11, 1920 in Delaware, Ohio to Walter and Ruth Ann Woolsey James.

He graduated from Will High School in Delaware, Ohio, received his under graduate degree from Ohio Wesleyan University and both his masters and Phd from New York University. He also was a graduate of the Adler Institute of Psychoanalysis.

Richard spent his professional as an instructor of Psychology at NYU, Central Washington State and Drake Universities. He also practiced clinical psychology in New York until his retirement in 1992.

He served his country during World War II in the United States Army and served as a diplomat of the American Board of Clinical Psychologists.
