Richard Orville “Dick” Heacox, 89, of Mesa, AZ died Tuesday afternoon, Dec. 8th in Mesa. He was born in Tanners Switch (near Sikeston), Missouri on June 27, 1920 the son of Dick and Ora (Acord) Heacox. A graduate of Bloomington High School, he was a member of the 1940 Indiana All-Star Basketball team. He attended Butler University where he played football and basketball, was a lifetime Chicago Cubs fan and enjoyed horses, big band music and playing poker. He was a retired heavy equipment operator and worked with asphalt paving companies.

During World War II he joined the U.S. Merchant Marine Corp and served in the North Atlantic making the Murmansk run aboard the liberty ship USS William Pepper.

Dick is survived by his wife of 61 years, Peggy Heacox of Mesa, two daughters Donna Jeanne Carter (husband Jim) of Utica, IN; Kerry Heacox of Florence, AZ and one son, Kevin Heacox of Indianapolis, IN; four grandchildren Chris Carter (wife Cheryl), Chuck Carter, John Carter (wife Gretchen) and Beth (Carter) Nifong (husband Scott) all of Utica, IN; twelve great grandchildren and four great-great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister Mary Geneva (Heacox) Gwaltney.

Funeral services will be held 11:00 a.m. Monday at Allen Funeral Home with burial to follow at Clear Creek Cemetery. Graveside military rites will be conducted by the Veterans Honor Guard. Friends may visit the family one

hour prior to services at the funeral home.
