Ronald W. Cornell, 73, of Ellettsville, passed away on Thursday, June 28, 2018, at Franciscan Health in Greenwood. He was born on April 27, 1945 in Lacross, Wisconsin, the son of Frank Cornell and Caroline (Krajewski) Golly.

Ron was a veteran of the United States Navy where he was discharged in 1966. He went on to serve in the Indiana National Guard until 1978. He retired from Crane Naval Base following 37 years of service where he worked building submarine cables.
