My own father had passed away not long before Dr. Wayne class, along with a lot of other personal problems I had at that time.

But because of Dr. Wayne I started healing myself and look forward to his classes, because he was very inspired person that enjoyed teaching.

Later on, when Ruth came to our facility, I was even more glad I had taken his class to help Ruth once in a while with her needs, whenever I could.

Though I only work part-time at Bell Trace, I would try and go and see how she was doing when I arrived at work. And boy did she love her coffee and "Ruffle" chips. haha.

There were a couple of times when Bell Trace was under a storm warning and we had to get the patients out of the rooms as a precaution.

Going up and down the halls I gave blankets out and snacks for the patients. Ruth was very understanding always smiling every time I came around. I would sign to her "Thank-you for being so patient with me. She just smiled and said, "Your a good person."

I thanked her and not long afterwards helped her back along with others to their rooms when the storm was clear and we knew it was safe.

Like Dr. Wayne, I was very inspired by her courage and strenght she gave during her illness. She was a very special lady, and one I will never forget.

I am so sorry to here of your loss but feel fortunate enough to have known your family.
