Ruth Louise Young Brogneaux died on Friday November 18, 2011 at the Meadowood Health Pavilion in Bloomington. She was preceded in death by her parents, Merrie Maude Cowles Young and Charles Franklin Young, and her siblings Nellie Mae. James Franklin, and Samuel Maurice, as well as her beloved husband. John Pierre Brogneaux.

Ruth is survived by daughters Patricia Jeanne Brogneaux Brennan (CDR Michael John) of Annandale. Virginia, and Diana Lynn Brogneaux Yoder (Frank Wallace Yoder, M.D.) of Dublin, Ohio. She is also survived by seven grandchildren: Kathleen Brennan Chappell (Steve), Sheila Brennan Wetherell (Ed), Mary-Clare Brennan Veteto (Jonathan), Michael P. Brennan (Amy), Megan B. Brennan. John W. Yoder (Jenny), and Benjamin Y. Yoder (Lori). In addition are great-grandchildren: Merrie and Emily Chappell,

Ruth graduated from Mount Auburn High School in Shelby County, Indiana.

and received a B.A. with distinction in her triple majors of English, music

and physical education from Ball State Teachers' College in Muncie,

Indiana. She was also a member and president of Psi Theta social sorority.

Following 12 years of piano lessons. and prior to attending Ball State, she

was an invited guest to perform classical piano selections on an

Indianapolis radio station. While at Ball State. she held numerous jobs to

earn her tuition, her favorite being the alto member of a musical trio that

collaborated with a local dance band. It was there, also. that she met her

future husband, John.

Following their marriage on June 3. 1936, Ruth taught physical education

and health for three years at Shelbyville High School. In addition, she

directed the junior and senior choirs, taking the junior high

school choir to a first-place win in Indiana state competition. After settling into the Bloomington community, Ruth became a charter member of the Bloomington Hospital Auxiliary, the Local Council of Women, eventually becoming its president, and a member of the Bloomington Hospital Board, holding various offices and becoming its president. She was a member of the Circle of Friends, comprised of former presidents of the Bloomington Hospital Board, and she volunteered for 28 years for the Bloomington Hospital. In addition, she became extremely involved as a member of the First Christian Church of Bloomington and was one of the first two female elders of the church. She was also joined by women of two other local churches in establishing the Opportunity House of Bloomington. As well, Ruth was active in the University Women's Club of Indiana University, and the Daughters of the American Revolution.

In her spare time. she was a substitute teacher of English at Bloomington South High School for 10 years, and worked for the Indiana University

School of Education editing the presented Master's Degree theses.

She

enjoyed her pastimes of reading, playing the piano, listening to classical

music and was an avid golfer at the Bloomington Country Club, where she

won a number of tournaments. In addition, she enjoyed bowling, playing

bridge and poker and she took great pleasure in the offerings of Indiana

University, from sports to theater. Her greatest joy, however, was traveling

the world with John and their many friends. Ruth cherished her family and

her multitude of friends, both in Bloomington and Naples, Florida, where

she and John "wintered" for 28 years.
